



## Do My Horse and I Qualify for Midwest Championship Classes?



1. Are both exhibitor and owner/lessee of horse to be shown residents of Zone 5?
  - a. **Yes** – proceed to #2
  - b. **No** – You do not qualify
2. Are both exhibitor and owner/lessee of horse to be shown current members of APHA?
  - a. **Yes** – proceed to #3
  - b. **No** – You do not qualify unless the non APHA member attains membership at this show
3. For youth or amateur exhibitors, do you or an immediate family member own or lease the horse you are exhibiting?
  - a. **Yes** – proceed to #4 for halter classes or #5 for performance classes
  - b. **No** – You do not qualify to show this horse in any Midwest Championship class
4. For halter exhibitors – have you placed in the Top 5 in any halter class at the APHA World Show with any horse in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, or 2016?
  - a. **No** – proceed to #7
  - b. **Yes** – you do not qualify to show in any Midwest Championship halter class
5. For regular youth 18 & under performance exhibitors only – have you placed in the Top 10 in any performance class (other than Youth Walk-Trot, Novice Youth, Intermediate level, or non-pointed World Show classes) at the APHA World Show with any horse in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, or 2016?
  - a. **No** – proceed to #8
  - b. **Yes** – you do not qualify to show in any Midwest Championship performance class
6. For novice youth, youth walk-trot, novice amateur, amateur walk-trot exhibitors only: have you placed in the Top 10 in any novice youth, youth walk-trot, novice amateur, or amateur walk-trot performance class (other than Intermediate level, or non-pointed World Show classes) at the APHA World Show with any horse in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, or 2016?
  - a. **No** – proceed to #8
  - b. **Yes** – you do not qualify to show in your respective novice youth, youth walk-trot, novice amateur or amateur walk-trot Midwest Championship performance classes, however, youth may show in the youth 18 & under hunt seat equitation and youth 18 & under horsemanship classes.
    - i. **Example #1:** you placed 3<sup>rd</sup> at the 2015 World show in youth walk-trot western pleasure. You may not enter any youth walk trot championship performance classes at this show, but you may enter all novice youth classes or the regular youth 18 and under classes.
    - ii. **Example #2:** You placed 6<sup>th</sup> at the 2013 APHA World show in novice youth hunter under saddle, you may not show in any novice youth

championship performances classes at this show but you may show in the youth 18 & under hunt seat equitation and youth 18 & under horsemanship classes.

- iii. **Example #3:** you placed 4<sup>th</sup> at the 2014 APHA World show in amateur walk-trot showmanship. You may not enter any amateur walk trot championship performance classes at this show, but you may enter all novice amateur classes.
7. For halter horses – has this horse placed in the Top 5 in any halter class at the APHA World Show with any exhibitor in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, or 2016?
  - a. **No** – proceed to #9
  - b. **Yes** – this horse does not qualify to show in any Midwest Championship halter class with any exhibitor
8. For performance horses – has this horse placed in the Top 10 in any performance class (other than Youth or Amateur Walk-Trot, Novice Youth, Novice Amateur, Intermediate level, or non-pointed World Show classes) at the APHA World Show with any exhibitor in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, or 2016?
  - a. **No** – proceed to #9
  - b. **Yes** – this horse does not qualify to show in any Midwest Championship performance class with any exhibitor
